

Guide to GROWING LEEKS







Planting: Plants can be set in spring. They should be spaced 2-4 inches apart in a 5" deep furrow. As the plant grows, continue to mound soil around stalks to blanch them, keeping the mounted soil just below leaf joints.

Care: Full sun, regular water and very rich soil. Leeks are not affected by many of the pests and disease that bother onions.

Harvest: When stems are ½ - 2 inches thick, usually about 4 to 7 months after setting the plants. Harvest before the ground freezes. Lift out with a spading fork.
