



GARLIC LIST

SOFTNECK

CALIFORNIA EARLY

One of the most adaptable and longest storing varieties. Very mild flavor. 10-16 cloves per bulb.

EARLY ITALIAN PURPLE

Vigorous grower adaptable to hotter summers. Large bulbs contain many small cloves.

INCHELIUM RED

From the Colville Indian Reservation, Inchehium Red garlic is a vigorous grower with a mild, sustained flavor with a little kick. Expect the flavor to become stronger with storage time. Stores well. 8-20 cloves per bulb.

KINGSLAND

Hailing from Idaho, Kingsland is a heavy producer with some bulbs reaching over 1/4 lb. Great for braiding. Stores over 9 months. 10-15 cloves per bulb.

MESSIDOR

Messidor is a French variety with large bulbs, great storage and 10-13 cloves per bulb.

NOOTKA ROSE

An heirloom variety from our own San Juan Islands, Nootka Rose garlic has a strong flavor packed in numerous small rosy cloves. Great for braiding.

SILVER ROSE

Silver Rose is an exceptionally long-storing variety, perfect for braiding. A fast-growing silverskin garlic, it can be planted in early spring. 12-15 rosy cloves per bulb.

HARDNECK

CHESNOK RED

Very large variety with a wonderful aroma, good for baking. 9-10 easy-to-peel cloves per bulb.

ELEPHANT

The large cloves of Elephant Garlic are very mild in taste and easy to peel. 4-6 cloves per bulb.

GERMAN PORCELAIN

Regarded as one of the best tasting varieties, it is a very large bulb with 4-8 easy-to peel cloves.

IVAN

Has jumbo cloves and a hot when raw, sweet when roasted flavor. Harvests slightly earlier and often grows a couple bonus cloves. It is widely grown in Canada. 5-8 cloves per bulb.

METECHI

Large and flavorful. It is very adaptable to a range of growing conditions. Stores well. 5-8 cloves per bulb.

MUSIK

Known for being a very high-yielding, cold-hardy variety. Stores for 6+ months. 4-8 red streaked cloves per bulb.

ROMANIAN RED

Gorgeous late season garlic with hot long-lasting flavor. Huge bulbs contain 4-5 cloves each.

RUSSIAN RED

A rocambole garlic brought to the PNW by immigrants in the 1900s. It can withstand very cold winters. 6-7 cloves per bulb.

SPANISH ROJA

Brought to the PNW prior to 1900 and is best suited for our colder microclimates. Spanish Roja is also sometimes known as Greek Blue. 7-13 purple-streaked cloves per bulb.

SVEA

Strong, hot and full-flavored. Svea garlic is great for cooking and baking. Store well. 5-8 plump, purple streaked cloves per bulb.
